# <u>SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT</u>



# **Mathematics:**

To finish out the school year, both the EDM and Glencoe classes will be focusing on writing expressions and geometry. Students will be wrapping up the 6th grade material as we near the end of the school year with a focus on the upcoming 7th grade skills. The students will continue to use iReady as a learning tool and will assess to determine their growth this school year.



# **Social Studies:**

In Social Studies classes, sixth graders have continued learning about how the United States was formed and the historical events that created A New Nation of the United States. We will continue our learning about expansion westward and the reasons why people migrated to form the western states with lessons on the California Gold Rush. Our learning will continue with the Industrial Revolution and how the creation of factories moved our country forward to become what it is today.

# Science:

To finish the school year, we will be looking at the Earth's rotation and revolution around the sun and the Moon's orbit around the Earth. We will focus on how these movements cause seasons, day and night, moon phases and eclipses. We will wrap up the year with a quick review of magnetism and electricity before moving on to 7th grade!

### ELA:

As we come to an end this school year in ELA, we will be finishing up by completing our Argumentative Writing Unit. We will continue to work through Unit 4 reading Informational text and discussing the Author's Point of View. Other skills this month include rereading using context clues, and reviewing Idioms. As always, students should be reading at least 20 minutes every night.
